Preparing for Two Services Beginning November I!

The Session and staff recently announced that we would be adding a second service of worship on Sunday, November 1. The purpose of adding a service is to accommodate more people for live, corporate worship. Now that most of the details are worked out, here is what you can expect beginning on November I:

- The first service will begin at 9am, the second at 10:30am.
- Both services will continue to utilize the social distancing layout we've been using to date, however, the first service will be <u>mask-mandatory</u> during the entire worship service, and the second service will be <u>mask-optional</u> once attendees are seated in their sitting area.
- Both services will have an identical order of service, although there may be occasional variations.
- You will still be ushered to and from assigned seating at both services. Assigned seating remains the same.
- We are encouraged not to use coat racks at this time. Please bring your coats into the sanctuary with you. Currently, there is plenty of room for them in your space!
- Please enter the church *masked* through the main doors. At the conclusion of the first service, attendees will exit through the Hospitality Room to the west side of the building (please park accordingly); second service attendees will be free to exit the building at the location of their choosing.
- Those arriving early for the second service will not be ushered in until the sanctuary is cleaned and reset for the second service.
- Fellowship will be available in the Great Hall after both services. This will be a mask-mandatory area with social distancing maintained. We will continue to encourage those congregating in the Narthex before and after services to make their way either into the sanctuary for worship, or to the Great Hall for fellowship.
