Communion February 14

Westkirk celebrates the Lord's Supper at each service on the second Sunday of the month. Open communion means that if you are a professing Christian who has put your faith and trust in God through Jesus Christ alone, and are a member in good standing at a local church anywhere, you are free to partake communion with us. The Conversion of Saul

Saul is speaking to a Jerusalem mob. They accuse him of many crimes because of his fervent preaching about Jesus. He stands on the stairs and motions with his hand to them. He tells them how he bound and gagged Christians, threw them into prisons. One day

he was near Damascus about noon. Suddenly an astonishing light enveloped him. His eyes burned as if stung by a hornet. Panic felt like a raging river about to drown him. A forest inside him crumbled, his life toppling like tinkertoys. The glare of the world unwound around him. He could hear the pounding pulse of music. A voice said to him, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?" The voice was Jesus. "What shall I do Lord?" he asked.

He is told to travel to Damascus. Led by those with him, he stumbled from blindness. A devout man named Ananias restored his sight. He said to him, "The God of our fathers has chosen you that you should know His will, and see the Just One, and hear the voice of His mouth."

Then his life was a revolution because of the astounding light of Jesus.

When Saul finished speaking, the Jerusalem Mob tore off their clothes, threw dust into the air, yelling, "Away with him, away with him from the earth! He is not fit to live!"
